## "The Most Dangerous Woman in America"

Mary Harris was born in Cork at the end of July 1837 and was baptised at the North Cathedral on 1st August of that year. The Harris family emigrated to Canada during the Great Famine.

Mary became a teacher and later a seamstress and moved to Memphis after her marriage to George Jones, a union moulder, in 1861. Tragedy



stuck when a yellow fever epidemic took the lives of her husband and four young children in 1867.

Having lost her dress making business in the Great Chicago fire of 1871, Mary Jones became involved in the growing trade union movement. By 1900 she worked to support miners and their families and became a tough and feared union organiser. Mary led many strikes for better pay and working conditions.

Mary organised the 'March of the Mill Children' in 1903, which highlighted the exploitation of young children in the mines, mills and factories of America. Now known throughout North America as simply Mother Jones, she was present at the launch of the IWW union in 1905. In subsequent years, Mother Jones organised labour extensively throughout America as well as Canada and Mexico.

During the brutal mines wars in West Virginia and Colorado from 1912-1914, Mother Jones played a prominent role and was arrested and jailed many times. She died in 1930 and is buried at Mt. Olive Union Cemetery in Illinois. An Irish flag from Shandon was recently flown over her grave. Her spirit remains alive and active wherever in the world there is a fight for labour and social justice.

There are now annual festivals to honour Mother Jones in Mt. Olive in Illinois, Chicago and Cork, each year. The City Of Chicago will shortly erect a statue in her honour. Cork City Council has officially designated August 1st as Mother Jones Day in Cork City. Cork has become recognised everywhere as the birthplace of this inspirational woman.


## A Decade of the Spirit of Mother Jones Awards
